- Player builds a tower with the corresponding number of blocks, counting as he/she builds.
- Player keeps rolling, counting, and stacking.

## Directions:

- Player 1 rolls two dice and finds the sum.
o Player 1 covers the sum with his/her marker.
- Player 2 rolls two dice and finds the sum.
- Player 2 covers the sum with his/her marker .
o The first player to get four in a row wins!

## Addition War

## Materials:

Deck of playing cards

Number of Players:
2


## Directions:

- Remove the jokers from the deck.
- Deal the deck between the two players until all of the cards are dealt.
- Each player turns over two cards.
- Each player adds his or her numbers together
- Whoever has the highest total keeps all four cards.
- If the totals are the same, each player places three cards face down and turns one card over.
- The player with the highest cards keep ALL of the cards in that round
- Continue to play until one player has all of the cards.

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\text { For younger students: } A=1, J=10, Q=10, K=10
$$ For older students: $A=1, J=11, Q=12, K=13$

## Salute

MaterialsDeck of playing cards
Number of Players3

## Directions:



- Player 1 and Player 2 split the deck into two equal piles and place them face down.
- Player 3 calls "Salute"" Players 1 and 2 each take a card off the top of their pile and place it against their forehead, number side facing out, without looking at the card's value.
- Player 3 looks at both cards and calls out the sum made by the two cards.
- Players 1 and 2 use the sum to determine the value of their own card. The first player to call out the correct value of their own card wins both cards.
- After all cards have been used, the player with the most cards wins the round.
- This game can also be played with multiplication facts (for older students)

Materials:
One die
Paper
Pencil
Number of Players:
2 or more


## Directions:

- Player 1 rolls two times and adds the two numbers together. He/she can then choose to keep rolling or stop at any time. Each new number rolled is added to the previous sum.
- If the player rolls a " 1 ", the amount added is lost and the player records a "0" for that turn.
- If the player chooses to stop, the player records the sum as his/her score
- It is now the next player's turn. Each recorded sum is added to the previous sum.
- The first player to reach 100 wins!
- This game can also be played with multiplication facts, but the target number should change to 500
